

Maths

€ Roll a dice (please ask your child's teacher if you need to borrow one) and write the number you need to make 10. Can you write this as a number sentence? For example- roll 4. $4 + 6 = 10$. Use your number bond knowledge to help you.

€ Choose a number of aliens and imagine they have 10 legs each. How many legs would there be altogether? Count in 10s or draw the number of legs to help you. You could repeat this with 2 or 5 legs each.

Understanding the World (science and geography)

€ Can you write a list of different things an alien might see here that are different to their home planet? Houses, trees etc. Could you sort your ideas into human features (built by humans- houses) or physical features (happens naturally- trees)?

€ What materials would you use to design a spacesuit? Remember an astronaut must be able to breathe, communicate and keep protected. Can you name the materials?

€ Can you name the 4 seasons? Can you draw a tree to match the seasons?

How do we feel? (PSHE)

€ We keep ourselves healthy by eating a balanced diet, getting plenty of exercise, drinking water, getting enough sleep and keeping ourselves clean. Can you explain to an alien what things they could do to keep themselves healthy? You might like to present this as a poster or a drawing with some sentences.
